





Record of School Achievement



The **Record of School Achievement (RoSA)** is the credential available to all students, following the completion of Year 10, who leave school prior to the completion of the HSC, or who are not eligible for the HSC credential.

If you decide to leave school, you will need to:

- ✓ speak with your Year Adviser/Coordinator/Careers Adviser to discuss your decision
- ✓ confirm the signing-out process
- ✓ check your school has placed a request for your RoSA credential with NESA, before you sign out
- ✓ request your NESA number from your school.
- ✓ activate your **Students Online** account
- ✓ log into *Students Online* to make sure your personal details are correct
- ✓ download your eRecord from *Students Online* to use as an interim result report. The eRecord can be used to support TAFE enrolment as proof of RoSA eligibility while awaiting the RoSA nomination from your school.




The HSC:


- is the culmination of a student's school career
- is the highest educational award that can be achieved at secondary school in NSW
- reports student achievement in terms of a standard achieved in individual courses
- presents a profile of student achievement across a broad range of subjects













Requirements for the HSC

Both the Year 11 and Year 12 pattern of study must include:

- 2 units of compulsory English
- at least 6 units of Board Developed Courses
- o at least 3 courses of 2 units value or greater
- at least 4 subjects (including English)
- a maximum of 6 units of Science may be included in the Year 11 pattern of study
- a maximum of 7 units of Science may be included in the Year 12 pattern of study.




Requirements for the HSC

HSC minimum standard

To be eligible for an HSC students need to demonstrate they have met a minimum standard in literacy and numeracy.

The HSC minimum standard is set at Level 3 of the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF)

Students need to achieve Level 3 or 4 in short online numeracy, reading and writing tests of skills for everyday life to meet the HSC minimum standard.







The principal certifies that you have completed a course, when there is enough evidence that you:

followed the course


applied yourself with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences that the school provided in the course

achieved some or all the course outcomes.



For most VET Industry Curriculum Framework courses, you must undertake set work placement hours to develop industry competencies and practise learned skills. You **must** complete any required work placement to complete these courses.





Students will receive a NESA Confirmation of Entry from the school.

Before signing the Confirmation of Entry each year (Years 10, 11 and 12) students should check that they are:

- enrolled in the appropriate courses
- eligible for their intended pathway:
- Record of School Achievement (RoSA)
- Higher School Certificate (HSC)
- the ATAR (if applicable)



HSC: All My Own Work is a program designed to help HSC students follow the principles and practices of good scholarship. This includes understanding, valuing and using ethical practices when locating and using information as part of their HSC studies.

To be eligible for the HSC, students must complete HSC: All My Own Work (or its equivalent) before they submit any work for Preliminary (Year 11) or HSC (Year 12) courses, unless they are only entered for Year 11 and Year 12 Life Skills courses.

Languages






Learning languages opens minds to difference where diversity is seen as a regular part of society. Proficiency in languages provides a national resource that encourages more effective engagement with the global community.

HSC Results




HSC results contain a detailed package of information about each student's achievements in each course. They are not a single number like an ATAR.

Your mark in each course is a 50:50 combination of your HSC exam mark and your school-based assessment mark.












Australian Tertiary Admission Rank





Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)



The ATAR:

- is for students wishing to gain a place at a university
- is a rank NOT a mark
- provides information about how a student performs overall in relation to other students
- is calculated by the University Admissions Centre (UAC)
- is NOT calculated by NESA.
